Interstate 15 Resurfacing in San Bernardino County From Hesperia to Mountain Pass

SAN BERNARDINO – The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will begin work on a \$2.2 million resurfacing project on Interstate 15 (I-15) from Hesperia to Mountain Pass just west of the Nevada State line in San Bernardino County. The project will feature bridge deck approach and departure resurfacing, side slope repair, joint seal replacement and removal of existing asphalt and installation of polyester concrete at various locations from Cajon Creek to the Micro Ditch Bridge.


The contractor, Velarde Concrete Construction, Inc. of San Fernando, CA will begin placing signage to prep for the construction work. There will be alternating lane closures both north and southbound beginning April 8 between the hours of 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. at various locations in and near Hesperia to just west of the Primm and the Nevada state line. On and off ramps will be subject to closure between the hours of 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. Be advised:

- Signage will be placed two miles ahead of impending lane closures.
- Outside lanes may be closed during construction with no full closures.
- Tuesday through Saturdays nightly and into Sunday mornings.
- No closures on the northbound I-15 on Friday nights.
- No closures on the southbound I-15 on Sunday nights into Monday morning.

The project is expected to be complete in late Fall of 2021. Schedules can change due to inclement weather.
