

Application for Temporary Noise Waiver

The Department of Environmental Protection is currently reviewing an application for a Temporary Noise Waiver as allowed under the Montgomery County Noise Control Ordinance, Chapter 31B, Section 11(a). The Department will receive comments on the application for a minimum of ten (10) days after distribution of this notice.

The Temporary Noise Waiver is being requested by Purple Line Maryland Transit Partners, 6811 Kenilworth Ave., Suite 3A, Riverdale, Maryland, for the purpose of relocating gas utility lines at the intersection of Bonifant St. and Georgia Ave., Silver Spring. This work will be performed by Michels Corporation and is part of the Purple Line Project and nighttime construction is being required to minimize disruptions from gas service outages, alleviate traffic congestion and increase safety for pedestrians. Potential noise generating activities include the use of a saw, excavation and backfilling equipment, vac truck, pipe installation and dump trucks with backup alarms. The work is scheduled to begin around June 28, 2021, and last about four weeks. Designated work hours are 7:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. Monday through Friday nights, but may be extended to other nights if required.
