Understanding/Talking with Your Clients about Suicide Risk and Suicide CBC

Training Description: Conversations around suicide can be challenging but are deeply important in our line of work. In this training, providers will learn how to work with at-risk service recipients and to support those that are contemplating suicide. This information is integral to all providers' professional growth, and saves lives.

Dr. Bianca Nguyen is a Public Psychiatry Fellow at Columbia / New York State Psychiatric Institute and recently joined the CBC team in August 2020 as part of her fellowship. Training Description: Skills Training in Affective and Interpersonal Regulation (STAIR) is a short-term trauma-informed, skills-focused treatment for PTSD and depression symptoms. The STAIR model consists of a 3 part, 8-session, progressive intervention that helps individuals reduce PTSD symptoms, strengthen emotional regulation and management, and improve the quality of interpersonal relationships. Since this is a three-part training, it is strongly recommended that you participate in all sections of the training. Part I will consist of an overview of the model and will cover the content of sessions 1-3.

Using Recovery Language CBC

Training Description: This training will look specifically at the language that we use when talking about behavioral health clients either with colleagues or to the clients themselves. We will explore what traditional model language is versus recovery language, and how to implement recovery language to improve services for the clients. This training will follow the tenet that "What I say about clients becomes how I treat clients, and how I treat clients becomes how they treat themselves."
