Definitions

¹Family Nurse Practitioner: An advance practice registered nurse that has graduated from a family nurse practitioner training program and is certified as a nurse practitioner by the California Board of Registered Nursing. ²Physician Assistant: A physician assistant is a primary care practitioner who meets the Div. 2, Ch. 7.7, Section 3501 of Business and Professions Code requirements, and is licensed by the Physician Assistant Board.

Recommended award methodology: 50 percent minimum of total maximum points

- 1. Exclude programs with incomplete applications.
- 2. Assign average score for Sections 1.1, 1.2, 2.1, and 2.3 to programs with no data available.
- 3. Arrange Total Score from highest to lowest score.
- 4. Award zero slots to programs with less than 50 percent of total maximum points.
- 5. Divide remaining number of applicants by five.
- 6. Award top quintile maximum award based on program size.
- 7. Award second and third quintiles 75 percent of maximum award based on program size.
- 8. Award remaining programs 50 percent of maximum award based on program size until funds are exhausted.
- 9. Round up half slots.
- 10. Commission adjusted quintiles to develop finalized award recommendations.
