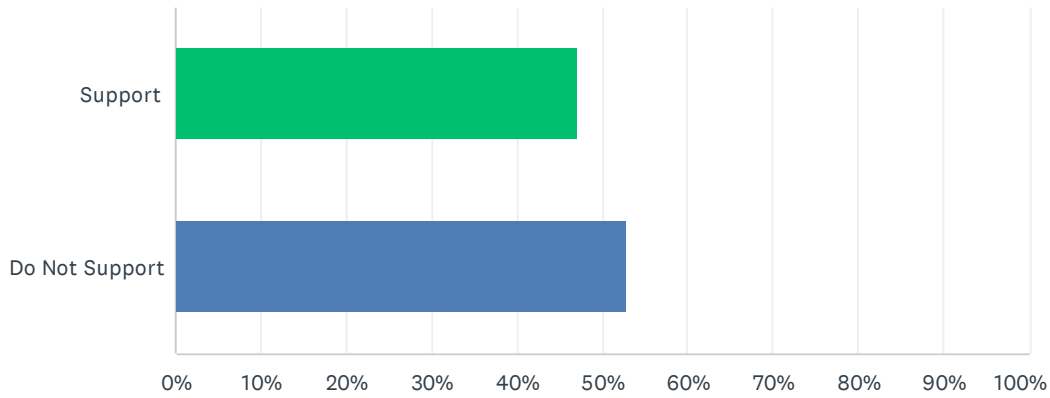


## Q1 Automatic Voter Registration - Provides for the automatic voting registration of individuals who have received an Enhanced Driver's license from the Department of Licensing.

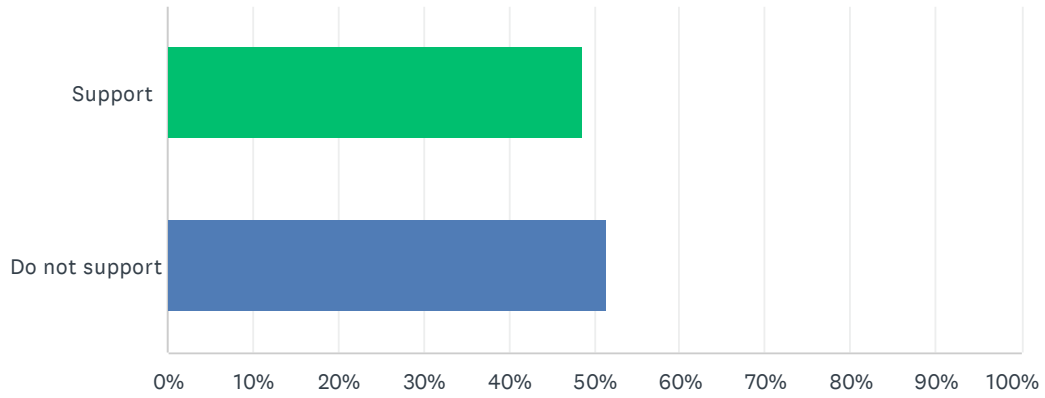

## Q2 Youth Voter Pre-Registration - Allows 16 and 17 year-olds to pre-register to vote, and then be added to the voter database when they are 18

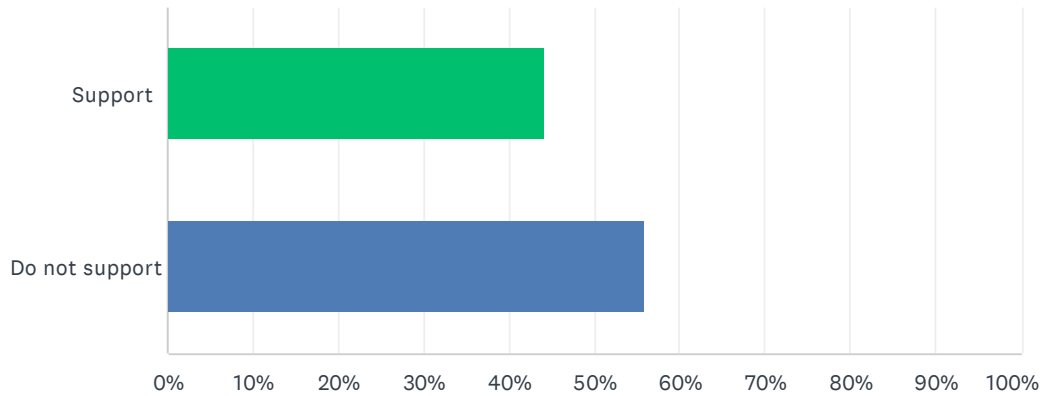

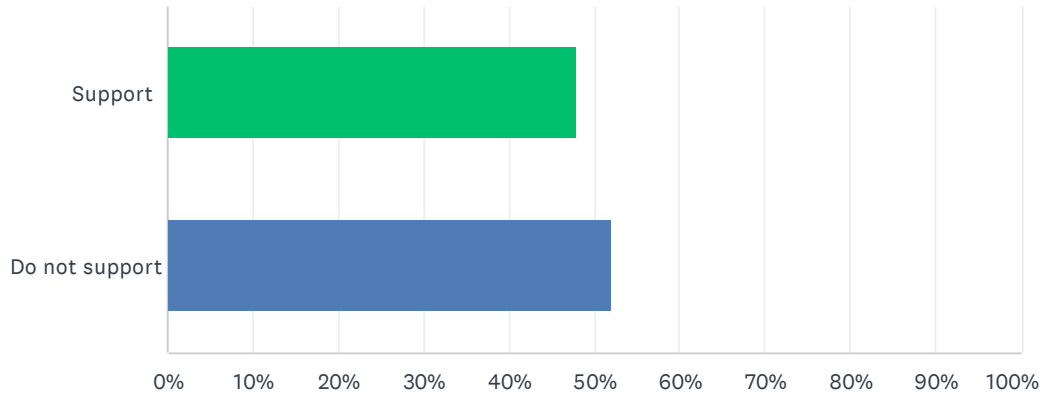

### Q4 Same-day Registration – Allows in-person registration by 8 p.m. on Election Day, or online or mail registration within eight days of the election.

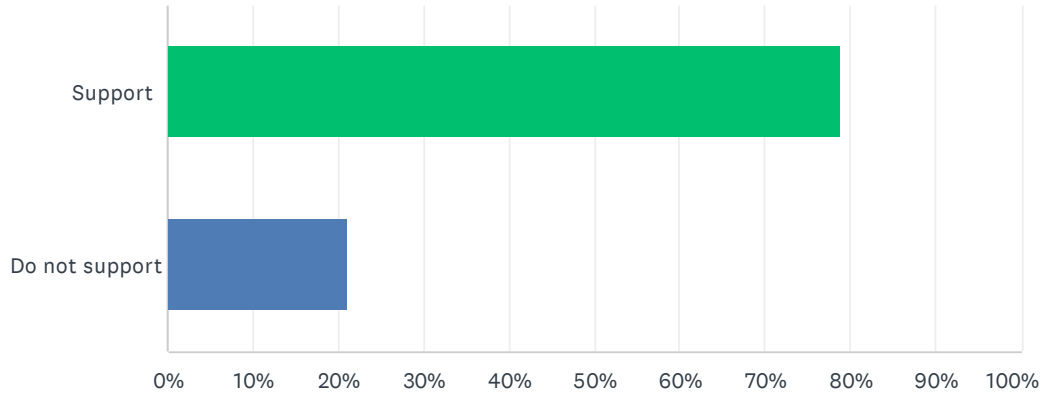

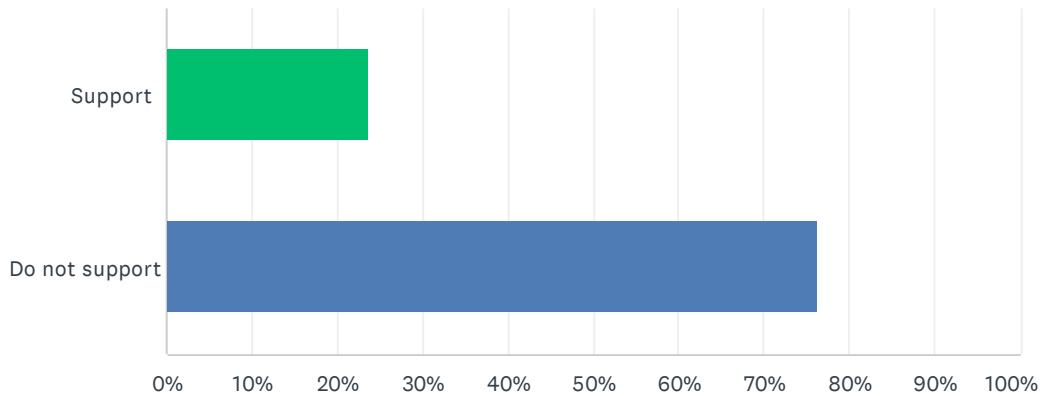

**Q6 HB 1014 – Creating a system of electoral voting by county for gubernatorial elections. 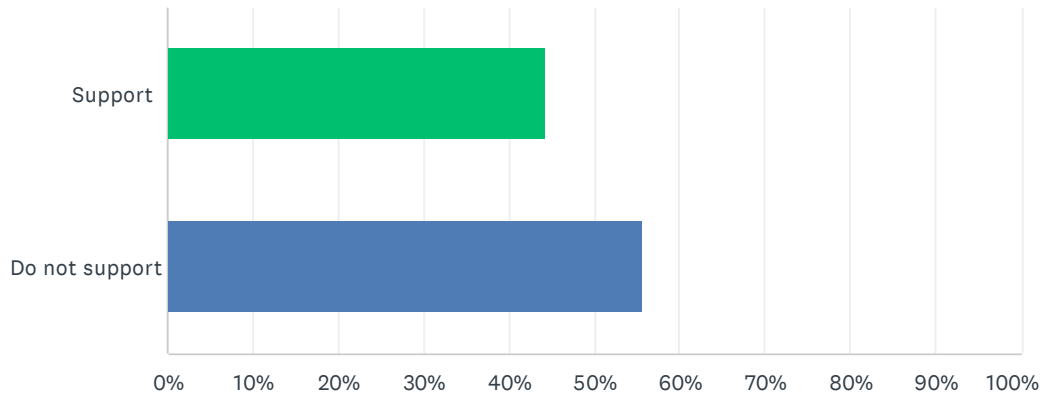

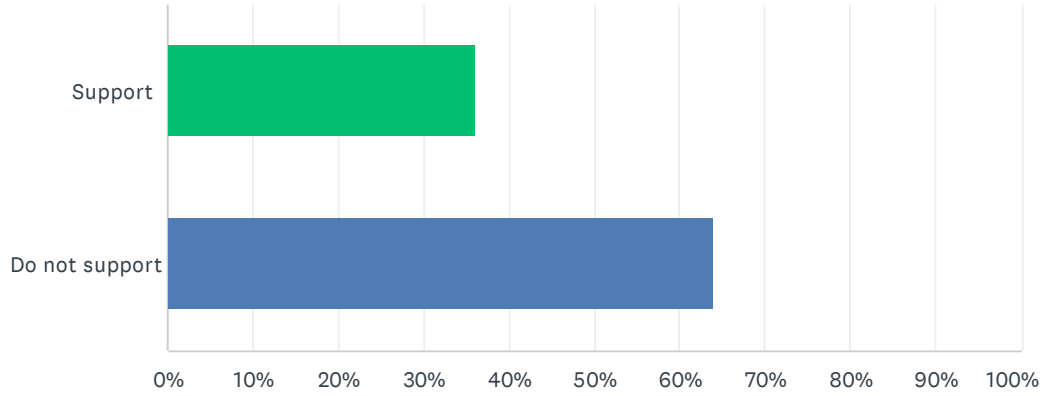

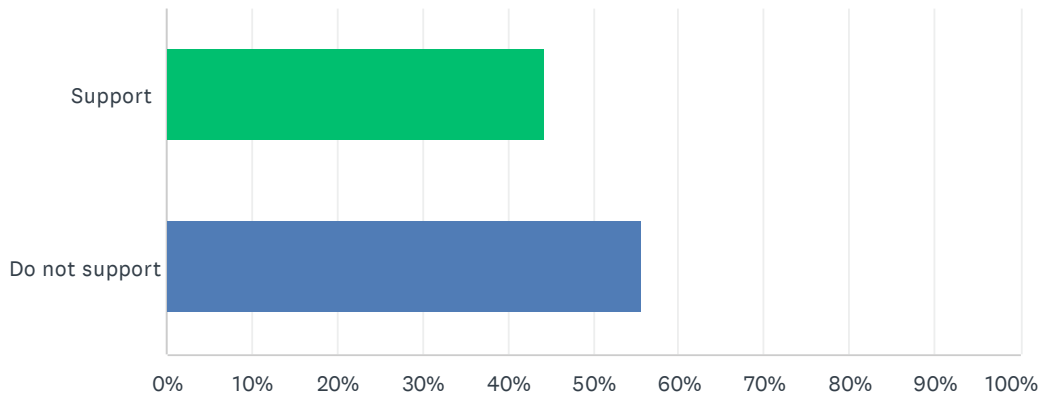
