Armenia. Armenia's energy sector has moved from a state of severe crisis in the early 1990's to relative stability today. A combination of policy, legal, regulatory, and institutional reforms have had good results. Armenia faces three principal challenges in its energy sector: an emerging supply gap, the need to maintain energy supply reliability, and the need to maintain affordable tariffs. Armenia has limited energy resources and can meet only a fraction of the total demand for energy from domestic resources. It imports oil and oil products from Georgia, Iran, Russia, and Europe. Nuclear fuel is imported from Russia. The government has adopted several laws focused on developing domestic, especially renewable, energy resources and implementing energy efficiency measures.
