USE

- Existing <u>categorical</u> <u>exclusions</u>.
- State <u>programmatic</u> agreements & checklists.
- Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act exemption.
- Web-based tools such as NEPAssist.

Be sure to...



CONSIDER

- Locations in previously developed areas and minimize ground disturbance.
- Installations that reduce visible intrusions on historic properties.
- Locations that are outside of floodplains.



AVOID

- Section 4(f) protected properties, including parks and recreation lands, wildlife and waterfowl refuges, and public/ private historic sites.
- <u>Listed</u> threatened/ endangered species and their habitat.
- Streams, rivers, and wetlands.
- Unusual circumstances.



In most instances, EV charging stations will be eligible for a categorical exclusion (CE).
