

Broad BH Workforce

HCAI

Overview: includes eight sub-modules that collectively form a multi-dimensional approach to behavioral health training and capacity expansion (funding: \$427M)

Initiatives include focus on specific provider types as well as cross-cutting strategies:

- Overall goal: improve the access to and quality of BH services by increasing the number of BH professionals and evolving their training to better meet children and youth needs
- Provider types include primary care providers, psychiatrists, social workers, peer personnel
- Cross-cutting strategies include apprenticeship models, training to serve justice and system-involved youth, building the BH workforce pipeline, and the SUD workforce

BH Coach Workforce

HCAI

Overview: aims to augment the BH workforce and increase availability of BH services for youth through the creation of a new role (funding: \$338M)

Preliminary goals for BH coach role:

- Engage directly with youth, while ensuring adequate training and supervision
- Serve vulnerable populations where they live, study and work
- Make BH roles accessible to a diverse population with lived experience
- Address some of the potential workforce gaps that exist today (e.g., few existing BH roles require 1-4 years of ed.)
- Ensure the role is both a desirable occupation in and of itself and a pathway to more advanced BH roles

Goal: Raise the behavioral health literacy of Californians to normalize and support the prevention and intervention of mental health and substance use.

- Youth Empowerment

Office of the California Surgeon General

Objectives:

- Increase awareness and understanding of Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) and toxic stress, and how they impact our health.
- Offer messages of hope that toxic stress is a treatable health condition and there are resources available for screening, treatment, and prevention.
- Share practical strategies for buffering care that parents and caregivers can provide to reduce the impact of ACEs on children and youth.













Target Audience:

Parents and caregivers of children and youth, with a focus on:

- Economically disadvantaged communities
- LGBTQ+ communities
- Communities of color, immigrants, and refugees
- Rural communities
- Juvenile justice-involved youth
- Child welfare-involved youth

Secondary Targets: Health care community, educators, legislators and other decision-makers to ensure understanding of ACEs and how to build a trauma-informed state.













Stakeholder Engagement:

- Recruit panel of subject matter experts to inform campaign strategy and messaging and serve as professional reviewers.
- Leverage focus groups and surveys to inform campaign development and gauge public understanding of ACEs.
- Collaborate with other state entities conducting public awareness for ACEs and toxic stress to align messaging, gain best practices/lessons learned.
- Campaign may include community events throughout California where families can learn more about ACEs, toxic stress and buffering care.













 Funding: 2021 Budget Act includes \$24M for public awareness campaign activities.

Efforts to date:

- February 4, 2022: RFP posted
- March 4, 2022: Responses to proposer questions posted
- March 22, 2022: Final date for proposal submission
- Week of May 9, 2022: Posting of Notice of Intent to Award (estimate)
- Week of June 6, 2022: Proposed Agreement Award Date (estimate)
- Late Summer: Campaign launch

Trauma-Informed Educator Training: Overview

Objective: to better enable early childcare providers, educators, and school personnel to do the following:

- Recognize the mechanisms and risks of ACEs and toxic stress
- Respond appropriately
- Intervene early
- Provide critical buffering support that can assist in averting the long-term harms of trauma and adversity exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic

Funding: \$1 million was allocated for this workstream













Trauma-Informed Educator Training: Milestones

- Spring 2022: Contract for training development signed
- Spring/Summer 2022: First convening with subject matter expert review panel
- Fall 2022: Training will be available to educators
- Winter 2022/Spring 2023: Evaluation















Trauma-Informed Educator Training: Stakeholder Engagement

Subject matter expert review panel will include

- Those with expertise in science- and evidence-based interventions
- Education and early childhood providers

Review of pilot curriculum

Curriculum will be piloted with early childcare providers and educators

Evaluation of first full implementation

Contractor to evaluate efficacy of training

School-Linked Fee Schedule and BH Provider Network

Workstream Overview

- By January 1, 2024, DHCS, in collaboration with DMHC, will develop and maintain:
 - A school-linked statewide fee schedule for outpatient mental health and substance use disorder services provided to a student, 25 years of age or younger, at or near a school-site
 - A school-linked statewide provider network of at or near school-site behavioral health counselors
- The Medi-Cal delivery system, including Medi-Cal managed care plans and county BH plans, **AND** commercial health plans are required to reimburse providers for a predefined set of medically necessary outpatient mental health and substance use disorder services provided to a student, 25 years of age or younger, at or near a school-site













School-Linked Partnerships and Capacity Grants (1/2)

Workstream Overview

- Provides direct grants to support new services to individuals 25 years of age and younger from schools, providers in school, school affiliated CBOs, or school-based health centers
- Will support statewide school-linked fee schedule and behavioral health network of providers
- 2021 Budget Act includes \$550,000,000 over two years
 - \$400,000,000 allocated to pre-school through 12th grade
 - \$150,000,000 allocated to institutions of higher education

Scaling Up Evidence Based Practices – Grants (1/2)

Workstream Overview

- With input from stakeholders, DHCS will select a limited number of evidencebased practices (EBPs) to scale throughout the state based on robust evidence for effectiveness, impact on racial equity, and sustainability
- Grants to be administered through a third-party grant administrator
- Grantees will be required to share standardized data in a statewide behavioral health dashboard
- 2021 Budget Act includes \$429,000,000 in FY 2022-2023
- DHCS will enter into an Interagency Agreement with Mental Health Services
 Oversight & Accountability Commission (MHSOAC); 10% of total funds
 earmarked for MHSOAC

Overview of Core CYBHI Workstreams (6 of 6)

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Commercial Health Plans Coverage for School-linked BH services

- The CYBHI requires commercial health plans to reimburse for certain behavioral health services for individuals 25 years of age or younger provided or arranged by local educational agencies and public institutions of higher education.
- The Department of Managed Health Care (DMHC) will issue guidance via an All- Plan Letter by December 31, 2023 to address commercial plan coverage of school-linked Behavioral Health services.
- DMHC's guidance will address the scope of services and billing issues.
- Regulations could be issued at a later date.
- DMHC will host a series of stakeholder working groups with advocates to discuss CYBHI policies and implementation.
- DMHC will provide regular updates to our stakeholders at existing quarterly meetings
