

Rating Action: Moody's Assigns Aa2 to Birmingham, AL's \$46M GO Ref Bonds, Series 2018-A and \$40M GO Warrants, Series 2018-B

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New York, July 26, 2018 -- Moody's Investors Service has assigned a Aa2 GOLT rating to the city of Birmingham, AL's \$46 million General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2018-A and \$40 million General Obligation Warrants, Series 2018-B. Moody's maintains the Aa2 rating on the city's outstanding parity debt as well as the Aa2 issuer rating. The issuer rating incorporates Moody's assessment of the city's implied unlimited general obligation pledge, however no debt is associated with this security. The outlook remains stable.

RATINGS RATIONALE

The Aa2 GOLT and issuer ratings reflects a diverse and regionally important economy, as well as a stable financial position marked by conservative management and solid reserve levels. The rating also takes into consideration an above-average but affordable debt burden.

RATING OUTLOOK

The stable outlook reflects our expectation that available reserves will approximate current levels over the near term, providing continued financial flexibility and stability.

FACTORS THAT COULD LEAD TO AN UPGRADE

- Significant improvement in socio-economic profile
- Sizeable decreases in debt burden
- Substantial increases in General Fund balance
- Improved pension funding

FACTORS THAT COULD LEAD TO A DOWNGRADE

- Declines in liquidity, both in the General Fund and other available reserve funds
- Significant increases in pension liabilities from poor pension funding
- Deterioration of tax base size and or quality

LEGAL SECURITY

The Series 2018-A Bonds and Series 2018-B Warrants are general obligations of the city for the payment of which the full faith and credit are irrevocably pledged.

USE OF PROCEEDS

Proceeds from the Series 2018-A GO Refunding Bonds will be used to currently refund the city's outstanding Series 2007-A GO Refunding Bonds for an expected net present value savings of 11.8% of refunded principal.

Proceeds from the Series 2018-B GO Warrants will be used to finance various capital projects including bus rapid transit, Legion Field and industrial park improvements.

PROFILE

The city of Birmingham is located in Jefferson County and is the largest city in Alabama with an estimated 2016 population of 212,424.
