Tonawanda Community Environmental Benefits Program Balloting Results

The Tonawanda Community Environmental Benefits Program community preferencing took place September 19 to 26, during which a total of 2,881 ballots were cast by eligible participants. The preferencing process was intentionally designed by the Community Foundation, the Advisory Panel and the State to ensure that all residents who were eligible to cast a ballot had the ability and opportunity to do so. To be eligible, participants had to reside in an affected community and be 16 years of age or older on the date the ballot was cast. Participants were required to cast a ballot for at least one project in each tier and allowed to cast ballots for up to 5 projects in each tier. To ensure equitable access to the process, balloting was offered both in-person at libraries and online at TonawandaFund.org. Every effort was made to ensure the public preferencing process was fair, transparent, and inclusive.
