

Q: How do Urban Design and Land Use Decisions Impact Placemaking?


A1: Typically Requires a Concentration of People and Businesses.

Urban Design Guidelines

Provide a variety of implementation strategies, include design details. They should reflect community priorities. (only applies to certain areas)

Zoning Ordinance, Codes, Public Facilities Manual, Roadway Standards, and other Regulations

Required for health and safety.
Should not interfere with the community's vision and should reflect current best practices.

Plans, Guidelines, and Regulations Influence

- Private-sector developments
- Municipal projects (Ex. street improvements, new public facilities and parks)

Ingredients of Place

- a. Accessible
- b. Mix of Commercial Uses and Housing
 - c. Destination-focused
- d. Distinctive Architecture and Authenticity
 - e. Memorable Public Spaces
- f. Comfortable and Safe Streets and Sidewalks
- g. A Strong Sense of Community Ownership and Collaboration






