Maroon Bells-Snowmass Wilderness Bear Resistant Container requirement

Am I required to use a bear-resistant food container in the Maroon Bells-Snowmass Wilderness?

Yes, you must store your food, trash and other attractants in an Interagency Grizzly Bear Committee-approved bear resistant food container at night. It's a good idea to keep all your food, trash and other attractants in bear-resistant containers during the day as well, although they're considered acceptably stored if they are within 100 feet and the direct sight of a person.

Why is this rule in place?

The Maroon Bells-Snowmass Wilderness Area has both a high number of backpackers and a high black bear population. Prior to the bear-resistant container requirement, negative bear-human interactions at campsites were common and bears were becoming increasingly bold. The food-storage requirement has greatly reduced these negative and dangerous interactions. Keeping bears from getting food from humans and campsites helps keep you safe, as well as the people who camp in the area after you, and the bears themselves.

Where can I get a bear-resistant food container?

Bear-resistant containers are available for sale from most outdoor equipment stores. You can rent them from several sporting goods stores within the Aspen-Sopris Ranger District area. The Aspen-Sopris Ranger District also has some available for loan; call 970 963-2266.
