

Emergency Winter Weather Plan 2019-2020

This Emergency Winter Weather Plan provides a coordinated response for times when extreme cold weather create additional, immediate need for expanded capacity to assist people experiencing homelessness in Lexington. Extreme temperatures often force people to seek shelter who may not otherwise seek assistance. In some cases, people struggling with mental illness may not seek shelter and require additional intervention for their own safety. This plan ensures Lexington is prepared for these situations.

The Emergency Winter Weather Plan will be activated when measures of extreme temperatures are reached or when other severe weather conditions take place. Extreme temperature will be defined as:

• Any day/night when the temperature low is expected to fall below 32 degrees

The wind chill will be not taken into account in the determining temperature. Decisions about severe weather that takes place on days outside of extreme temperature situations will be made by the Office of Homelessness Prevention and Intervention in consultation with the appropriate authorities.

Any time the plan has been activated, the Office of Homelessness will notify local media, provide updates on social media, and notify all organizations that work with people experiencing homelessness.

It's important to note that, unless otherwise stated, shelters and services are always available to people in Lexington who experience homelessness. The Emergency Winter Weather Plan activates some changes such as transportation or extended hours but Lexington is fortunate to have a strong network of shelters and service providers that is able to meet most needs even during weather emergencies.

Donations for Extreme Weather

Public donations can be dropped off at any participating agency. In general, agencies will be in need of the following items, but please always call and verify the need with the agency prior to drop-off.

Winter:

- Blankets
- Hats
- Winter Boots/Shoes
- Winter Coats, especially size L, XL, and XXL
- Gloves
- Socks
- Scarves
- Hot Hands
- Toiletries

Emergency Night Shelters

Emergency night shelters welcome all eligible people during emergency winter weather including former residents under suspension for behavioral or programmatic reasons.

Exceptions may include individuals suspended for violence and decisions will be made case by case. The OHPI will collaborate with providers and other resources to ensure emergency shelter is available for anyone in need. Stakeholders may contact the OHPI 24/7/365 for planning and arrangements.

Emergency Day Centers

Emergency day centers welcome all eligible people during emergency winter weather including former residents under suspension for behavioral or programmatic reasons.

Exceptions may include individuals suspended for violence and decisions will be made case by case. The OHPI will collaborate with providers and other resources to ensure emergency shelter is available for anyone in need. Stakeholders may contact the OHPI 24/7/365 for planning and arrangements.
