Vaccine Allotments and Distribution

On December 23, 2020, the Montgomery County Health Department received its first allotment of vaccine to be distributed in accordance with the Maryland State vaccination plan. Vaccine allotted to the County Health Department does not include vaccine directly distributed to hospitals or administered to long-term care and other facilities that are being vaccinated through contracts with private pharmacies.

The County website says that as of January 12 (prior to current week allotment), the County had received 12,900 doses and had administered 12,641 (98%). On January 14, 2021, the Department of Health and Human Services reported to the Health and Human Services Committee that to date the County had received 19,800 doses and had administered 14,952. Of that amount 6,900 doses were delivered on January 12 and 100 of the doses are for second doses.
