COUNCIL DECISION POINTS & COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION

- This supplemental appropriation was introduced on May 27, 2021.

DESCRIPTION/ISSUES

The County Executive proposes an amendment and supplemental appropriation to the FY21-26 CIP and FY21 Capital Budget in the amount of \$7,600,000 (source of funds: GO Bonds) to fund the reacquisition of the Larchmont Elementary School property in the Kensington/Wheaton area.

The property is currently a closed school site and the home of the Grace Episcopal Day School (GEDS), a private educational facility. The property was transferred to GEDS but the County retained a Right of First Refusal (ROFR) in order to exercise its ability to reacquire the property for a future public use. The County intends to lease the property back to GEDS for an initial 10-year term. The Council's approval of this reacquisition includes approval of the lease of the property to GEDS.

I am recommending a supplemental appropriation to the FY21 Capital Budget and amendment to the FY21-26 Capital Improvements Program in the amount of \$7,600,000 for the Reacquisition of Larchmont Elementary School Property (No. P362201). Appropriation for this project will fund the reacquisition of this closed school site in the Kensington-Wheaton area.

This increase is needed to avoid delay in the County's position to exercise its right of first refusal to purchase this property. This is a significant opportunity for the County to acquire property with considerable potential for public benefit. Immediately following the purchase of this property, the County will lease the school building back to the current owner for continued use as a private school.

I recommend that the County Council approve this supplemental appropriation and amendment to the FY21-26 Capital Improvements Program in the amount of \$7,600,000 and specify the source of funds as GO Bonds.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project funds the reacquisition of the Larchmont Elementary School property, which was previously sold by the County to Grace Episcopal Church. The County will exercise its right of first refusal to purchase the property. The County will lease the school building, currently operated as a private school, back to the current owner until the property is needed for public use. The current owner will fund any necessary capital improvements to the school building.

LOCATION

9411 Connecticut Avenue, Kensington, MD 20895

ESTIMATED SCHEDULE

Closing on this purchase is expected in August 2021.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION

This property is an ideal candidate for future public purpose. The intended arrangement will allow for continued operation as a private school while funding necessary capital improvements at no cost to the County.

Background

- 1. Section 307 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that any supplemental appropriation shall be recommended by the County Executive who shall specify the source of funds to finance it. The Council shall hold a public hearing on each proposed supplemental appropriation after at least one week's notice. A supplemental appropriation that would comply with, avail the County of, or put into effect a grant or a Federal, State or County law or regulation, or one that is approved after January 1 of any fiscal year, requires an affirmative vote of five Councilmembers. A supplemental appropriation for any other purpose that is approved before January 1 of any fiscal year requires an affirmative vote of six Councilmembers. The Council may, in a single action, approve more than one supplemental appropriation. The Executive may disapprove or reduce a supplemental appropriation, and the Council may reapprove the appropriation, as if it were an item in the annual budget.
- 2. Section 302 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that the Council may amend an approved capital improvements program at any time by an affirmative vote of no fewer than six members of the Council.
- 3. The County Executive recommends the following capital project appropriation increases:
