On September 23, the CDC Tracker showed that 88.4% of Montgomery County's <u>eligible</u> population is fully vaccinated.

## Montgomery County Case Metrics (from Montgomery County website)

Montgomery County continues to monitor metrics regarding the spread and prevalence of COVID-19 in the community. The primary indicators follow the CDC Tracker which classifies metrics by Low, Moderate, Substantial, and High. The secondary metrics are classified as the county as Very High, High, Moderate, Low, or Very Low risk of transmission/utilization. Number of cases per 100,000 residents in the past 7 days. As of September 23, there was a **SUBSTANTIAL** level of transmission.

Test positivity rate – 7-day average percentage of tests administered resulting in a positive case. As of September 22, there was a **LOW** risk of transmission.

#### Secondary Indicators

Percent change in new cases per 100,000 population during the last seven days compared to the previous seven days. As of September 23, there was a **VERY LOW** risk of transmission.

Percent of hospital inpatient beds in the community that are occupied. As of September 16 (last reported data) 73.8% of beds were occupied which is a **LOW** rate of utilization.

Percent of Intensive Care Unit (ICU) beds in use. As of September 16 (last reported date) 72.3% of ICU beds were in use which is a **LOW** rate of utilization.

Percent of inpatient beds in the community occupied by patients with COVID-19. As of September 16 (last reported date) 8.8% of beds were occupied with COVID-19 patients which is a **MODERATE** rate of utilization.
