On December 1, 2021, the CDC Tracker showed that 93% of Montgomery County’s population aged 12 and over is fully vaccinated.

Montgomery County Case Metrics (from Montgomery County website)

Montgomery County continues to monitor metrics regarding the spread and prevalence of COVID-19 in the community. The primary indicators follow the CDC Tracker which classifies metrics by Low, Moderate, Substantial, and High. The secondary metrics are classified as the county as Very High, High, Moderate, Low, or Very Low risk of transmission/utilization. Percent change in new cases per 100,000 population during the last seven days compared to the previous seven days. As of December 1, 2021, there was a **SUBSTANTIAL** risk of transmission.

Percent of hospital inpatient beds in the community that are occupied. As of November 25 (last reported data) 62.6% of beds were occupied which is a **LOW** rate of utilization.

Percent of Intensive Care Unit (ICU) beds in use. As of November 25 (last reported date) 65.9% of ICU beds were in use which is a **LOW** rate of utilization.

Percent of inpatient beds in the community occupied by patients with COVID-19. As of November 25 (last reported date) 5.0% of beds were occupied with COVID-19 patients which is a **LOW** rate of utilization.
