Aviation as a Department & Fund



- Aviation is a new department to the City of Philadelphia "92"
 - We were once a division under the Commerce Department "42"
- Aviation is one of the city's two enterprise funds
 - Water Dept is the city's other enterprise fund
- Aviation is both a department and a fund
 - They're several departments that's on our fund
- Unlike any other city departments, Aviation have multiple operating budgets
 - Mayor's Budget (City Budget)
 - Rates and Charges Budget (Airline/Airport Budget)
 - Operating Budget (Unit's Budget)



Aviation's Budgets



- Mayor's Budget (City Budget)
 - The Mayor's Budget gives the authority/permission to spend funding
 - The Operating Budget Call comes out Dec 1st and all requests are due the top of the calendar year
 - Requires City Council approval
- Rates and Charges Budget (Airline/Airport Budget)
 - Airline negotiating meetings are "typically" Apr/May
 - An agreement for the coming fiscal budget is "typically" agreed upon late May/early June
- Operating Budget
 - This budget is created once the R/C budget is final and it's administered earliest late June, but no later than July 1st
- Operating Fiscal Year is July 1 June 30

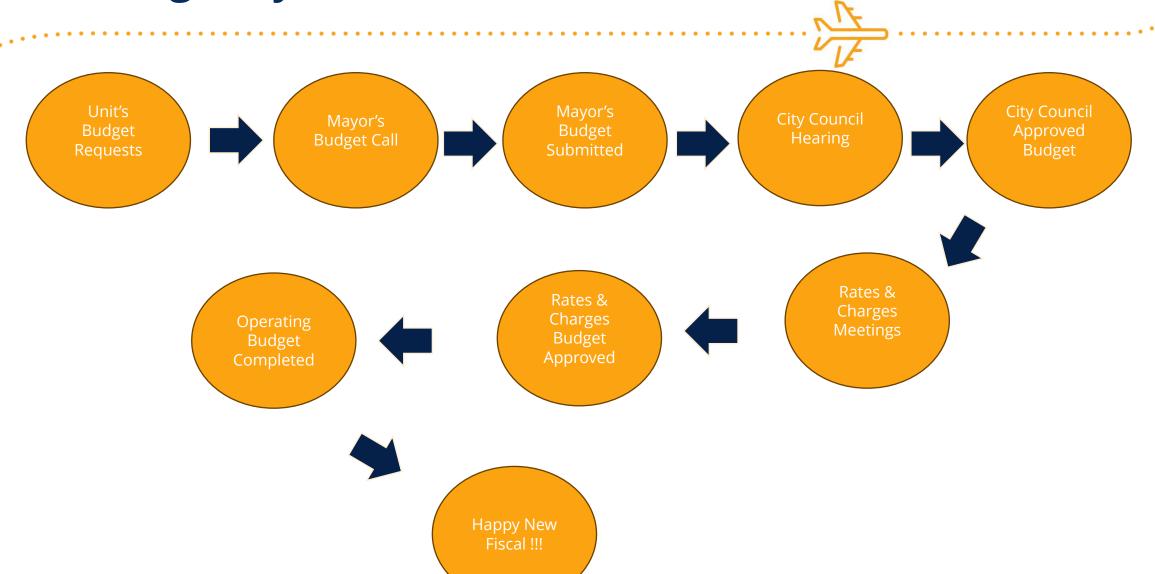








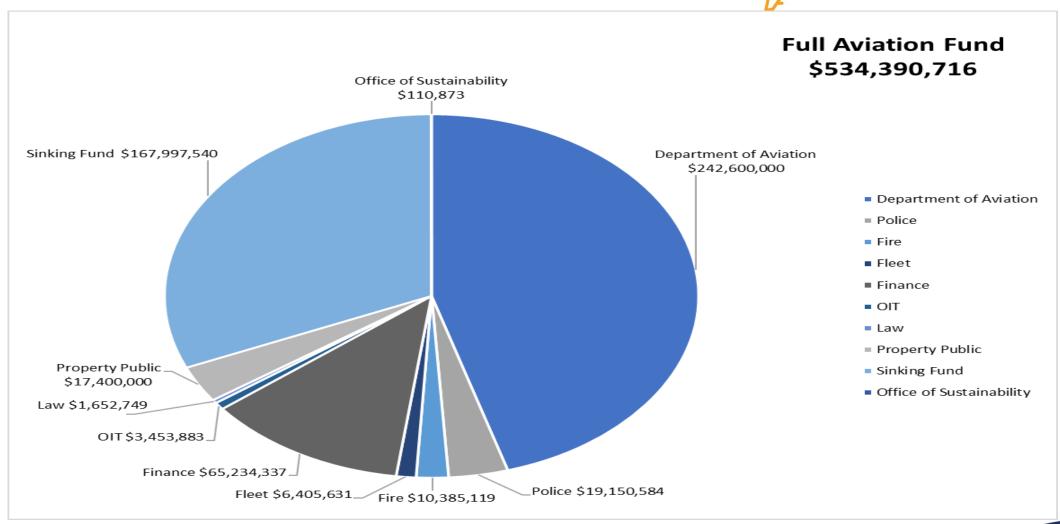

FY24 Aviation & Aviation Fund Budgets

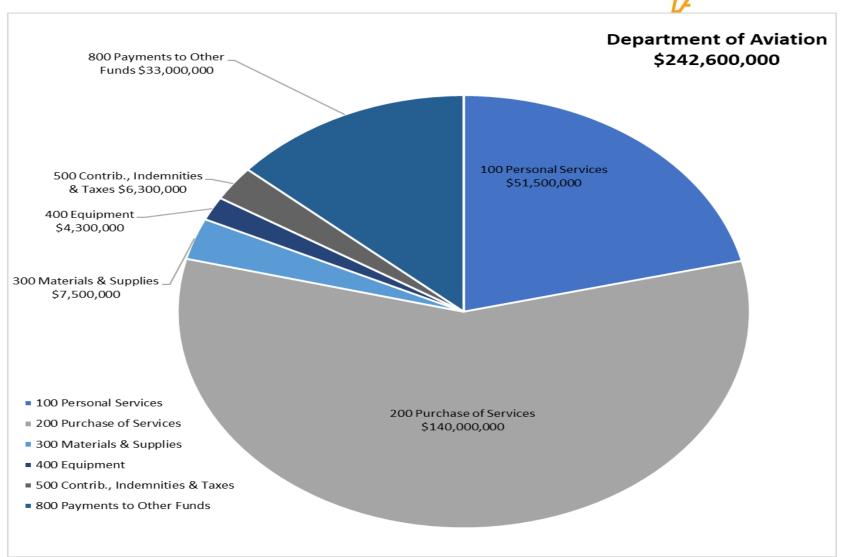






FY24 Department of Aviation Budget
